lake	water surrounded by land
landform	a natural feature of a land surface
latitude	distance north or south from the equator
	measured in degrees
legend	an explanation of the symbols on a map or chart, also called a key
location	the exact place, limit, or position of something
longitude	distance measured by degrees east or west from the prime meridian

mountain	high rocky land with steep sides
ocean	a large body of salt water
parallels	lying or moving in the same direction but always the same distance apart; latitude or longitude lines
peninsula	land surrounded by water on three sides
plains	a broad area of level or rolling treeless country
prime meridian	the meridian of 0° longitude from which other longitudes are calculated
region	a part, portion, or area having no fixed boundaries
river	flowing water that empties into a large body of water
scale	a proportion from which one can determine the actual size of something
time zone	one of the 24 longitudinal divisions of the earth from which time is measured
valley	a low land between hills or mountains
